Last week, Cathy and I went to St. Francis Springs Prayer Center just north of Greensboro for a couple of days for spiritual retreat. Unlike a vacation where people go to 'get away from it all,' we went there to get closer to the source of it all.

As I reflect, I wonder if that is why so many times, when people come back from vacations, they are so tired; we go to escape when we should be going to get closer. The silence, time for prayer and readings, journaling, and walking in the woods was powerfully refreshing. Jesus said, "Come to me all who are weary and heavy laden, and I will give you rest" (Matthew 11:28). When we are tired and overwhelmed, we try to escape when we should be working to draw nearer to God. We set aside time to get away when we should be making time to grow closer.

Anyway, while I was there, I began to think about my newsletter article for this month. Sitting on a bench, I found myself looking at the forest. Tall oaks were growing next to maple and poplar trees. Beneath them were dogwoods enjoying the shade the taller trees provided; closer to the ground were azaleas that next spring will bloom announcing the arrival of yet another year. As I took it in, I imagined older sages with wisdom to share, younger trees growing toward the sun, saplings sprouting up from the leaves announcing to all that the forest will live on long after the old oak falls, a victim of storms or a blight that diseases its once vibrant strength. Looking at these trees, I thought of the church and how we too resemble the variety of a thriving forest. We are a gathering of species in different stages of life, reaching up towards God for meaning, purpose, and sustenance.

As my eyes danced like a squirrel from one tree to another, one especially caught my eye. It was a saintly oak. What was unique was that this tree was partially broken in the middle, giving the appearance of a person in prayer. It bowed low to the ground, its leaves remaining lush and lively. Battered by the storm that assailed it, the oak remained faithful. Its roots went deep into the soil, evidence of years of growth, drawing from the earth, trusting in the sun to continue to provide. My eyes settled on this tree for longer than a moment. It spoke deep to deep as I thought of those who I have known in church who remain fixed to their faith even when storms have done their best to break them.

The priest at St. Francis uses a walker to get around. He is bent like that tree. His roots go deep into the faith that sustains him. I have seen this too in the churches I have served. I have enjoyed the witness of faithful believers whose faith remains strong long after storms have done their best to beat them down. Their testimony encourages me to put my roots deeper into the soil of faith, into the life of Christ who give me strength. I have seen Christians bearing witness as they suffer through cancer, broken marriages, disappointments, loneliness, and old age. I have witnessed leaves growing on bent and beaten bodies because their roots are set deep in the life of Christ who does not fail them. And as I think of them, I can't help but think that they are the most beautiful ones among us.

Outside the chapel at St. Francis Springs is a verse framed for all to see as they enter to ask their questions and seek peace, to confess their sins, long for presence and the knowledge of being loved and included: "Be still and know that I am God" (Psalm 46:10). Perhaps what we need is not time away but time to be still. Maybe what we really need is renewal, the renewal only God can provide.
