Reflection is a wonderful tool in moving forward. Henry Blackaby once said if you want to know where God is leading you, look to see where you have already been. So, as I think about the next three newsletter articles I'll compose, I thought I'd spend a few moments sharing things about our ministry together of which I am most proud.

To begin, I am proud of how we have become more mission focused these last 20-years. First Baptist Church has a rich heritage in being missional. Long before I arrived, the Women's Missionary Union at FBC was strong in teaching about and participating in mission work. Being missions minded is a hallmark of Baptist identity. We take seriously Jesus' words in the Great Commission; "Go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely, I am with you always, to the very end of the age" (Matthew 28:19-20).

Prior to our arrival at First Baptist in 2003, a group went to Winter Park Baptist Church in Wilmington to study their Operation In-As-Much outreach. Sensing a deeper desire to be more involved in local missions, they went to observe hoping to bring back ideas so that First Baptist could help our neighbors better. From their vision, our Operation In-As-Much outreach led day-long events to assist people in Dunn, the construction of handicap ramps, yard sales to provide funds for greater involvement in offering benevolence, donation of clothing and materials to other organizations, the creation of a food pantry at the church that evolved into our partnership with other churches at the Dunn United Ministerial Association Food Pantry. I am proud of how God continues to produce fruit from the seeds they brought home that weekend.

Another area of missions for which I am grateful is our work beyond the city limits. During a former pastor's tenure, a group went to South Africa on a mission trip. It was life changing for those who participated. Here, too, the seeds were planted. When I expressed to the pulpit committee that I was interested in being in a church that participated in Partnership Missions, the chair, Richard Carr said, "That's what we want too!" During the last 20-years we have been to Ukraine working to help build The Village of Hope, traveled to Belize to build a hurricane shelter, several houses, and among other things, a camp/conference center for the churches in that area. Twice we went to the Gulf after Hurricane Katrina and to New Jersey after Superstorm Sandy. We have been to various locations in North Carolina after tornados and floods---including helping folks here in Harnett County. Our youth went to Kentucky to help build homes and to Red Springs and Caswell on mission trips. From the seeds that were planted following that first trip to South Africa, we have seen much fruit.

Personally, I can take little credit for our missions outreach these last 20 years. God planted the seeds many years before I arrived. My mission trips to Germany while at Oak Level ignited the passion in me. God provided a place for me to serve where that passion was already lit. I am so proud of First Baptist Church for its missional identity. As I look back at how the seeds from prior to my arrival have grown, I know that the seeds we have planted during these years will also continue to produce. God has used us and will continue to use us when we are faithful. There is much for which to be thankful. We have been very blessed! Seeing where we have been, the future looks great for First Baptist Church.
